



Points of View Reference Center is a comprehensive full-text database that provides students with a series of essays that present multiple sides of today's most controversial scientific, social, economic, and political issues. Each of the more than 340 topics features the following four main essays:

- *Overview*—an objective background description.
- *Point*—the arguments supporting one side of the issue.
- *Counterpoint*—the arguments supporting the opposing side.
- *Guide to Critical Analysis*—questions and tips to help students analyze the issue in depth.

In addition, *Points of View Reference Center* lets students easily search leading political magazines from both sides of the aisle, newspapers, radio and TV news transcripts, primary source documents, and reference books for more information. POV is updated twice a day.
