

Each of the more than 340 topics features the following four main essays:

- Overview—an objective background description.
- *Point* –the arguments supporting one side of the issue.
- Counterpoint –the arguments supporting the opposing side.
- Guide to Critical Analysis—questions and tips to helps students analyze the issue in depth.


