Monday, August 29

Review the blue syllabus and your back to school stations packet to prepare for the quiz.

 - Write name and class on front cover in ink
 - Set up table of contents
 - Record page 1 Alliteration
- 8. Introduce bell ringer activities: Literary Term (alliteration)

- Distribute alliteration WS and read through the information as a class
- Allow time for students to cut parts and glue on page 1 of interactive notebook
- Have students listen for examples of alliteration during Carrie Underwood's "Blown Away" 1:42-2:00

- Have students work with 12:00 buddies to write one example of alliteration from the read aloud and one original example of alliteration in the notebook
- Have each partner group share their best example with the class

- 10. Administer the syllabus quiz
 - Students may use the Classroom Information and Procedures packet as a resource during the quiz
 - The quiz will be 13 points with a bonus opportunity

 - Have students glue lyrics on page 1

 - Have students work with elbow buddies to complete "What Is It?"
 - Review and make corrections
 - Color and glue parts of speech, definitions, and examples on page 2
 - Distribute the Parts of Speech practice WS—due Wednesday
- 4. Visit the library for "Book Tasting" with Mrs. Keister
- 5. Continue "Back to School" stations—students should be finished with ALL station work by Wednesday

- 5. Discuss format of tomorrow's assessment over parts of speech
 - Students may use practice WS and interactive notebook as resources during the assessment
 - Assessment is worth 15 points
- 6. Add to the Interactive Notebook
 - Set up the Table of Contents—Record page 4 Citing Text Evidence
 - Have students trace over the letter and diamonds of the red card so that it looks like a card that belongs in the diamond suit
 - Color the card holder. Keep it in reds, blacks, and grays
 - Cut out the cards and the card holder
 - Write the explanations for Answer, Cite, Explain on the cards
 - You will only need to glue the side edges and bottom of the card holder/pocket. Do NOT put any glue in the middle or along any of the rounded portion.
 - Once the glue has dried, store the cards in the pocket
- 7. Continue this quarter's read aloud: *The Devil's Arithmetic*
 - Review chapter 1 as a class—complete comprehension questions, emphasizing the importance of citing text evidence
- 8. Continue "Back to School" stations—students should be finished with ALL station work by Thursday

- 5. Distribute the assessment over parts of speech
 - Students may use practice WS and interactive notebook as resources during the assessment
 - Assessment is worth 15 points
- 6. Visit the library to check out/renew/return books
- 7. Continue this quarter's read aloud: The Devil's Arithmetic
 - Review chapter 2 as a class—complete comprehension questions, emphasizing the importance of citing text evidence
- 8. Continue "Back to School" stations—students should be finished with ALL station work by Thursday
